## VOLUME I - JANUARY 23, 2023

Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham was sworn in for her second term as the Governor of New Mexico on January 1, 2023. In her Inaugural Address, she ran down a list of the primary issues she plans to address in her second term, including early childhood education, affordable housing, and opioid addiction. Regarding housing, the Governor said, "with a new focus and funding to match, we will fight the scourge of homelessness that afflicts so many New Mexicans who are suffering...building serious momentum on affordable housing can be a hallmark of the next four years, and I look forward to working hand-in-hand with the legislature to achieve it."

## POLITICAL COMPOSITION OF THE LEGISLATURE

House of Representatives -45 Democrats, 25 Republicans

Senate -27 Democrats, 15 Republicans



The 56<sup>th</sup> Legislature of the State of New Mexico began its 60-day session on Tuesday,

January 17, 2023. Both the House of Representatives and Senate came to order around noon for opening ceremonies. Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham issued her fifth State of the State address, the first of her second term as governor, laying out her legislative priorities for the 2023 legislative session. Regarding housing and homelessness, the Governor said "I am requesting over \$100 million for housing programs, including mobile homelessness response teams that serve unhoused residents; eviction protection that keeps families in place; down payment assistance that helps people start a new chapter and begin to build equity; and investments in the Mortgage Finance Authority, which are matched exponentially by federal funding. **We need thousands more homes – so let's build them**."
