

## **VOLUME III - February 6, 2023**

It is day 21 of the 60-day Legislative Session (that is 39 days until the session concludes, in case you are keeping track!). So far, **627** pieces of legislation have been introduced, **287** in the House of Representatives and **340** in the Senate. Legislators have **10** more days to get their bills drafted and filed with Legislative Council Service before the February 16th Deadline for Introduction.

<u>House Bill 1</u> is the lone bill that has passed both chambers and signed by the Governor, enacting it as law. HB 1 is largely an appropriation bill that funds the Legislative Branch of New Mexico State Government.

This session, HB 1 drew some controversy which let to debate in the chambers regarding the addition of language and dollars (\$2,500,000) for a feasibility study that would advise the legislature on logistics and resources needed for district staff offices and operations for the legislature.



## **#NMREALTORParty**

The NMAR Legislative Committee meets weekly to discuss legislation that directly and/or indirectly affects the industry and its members. As of February 6, 2023, the committee and staff are **MONITORING 40+ pieces of legislation**.

NMAR **SUPPORTS HJR 5** and **HJR 6** (Alcon) which would extend property tax exemption to all disabled veterans and increase property tax exemption to honorably discharged veterans, respectively.

NMAR **SUPPORTS SB 133** (Stewart) which would forbid a secondhand metal dealer of receiving/ purchasing restricted metal items, including catalytic converters.

NMAR **SUPPORTS SB 139**, **140**, and **141** (Rodriguez) *which would* appropriate funding to address homeless health care, housing, and the New Mexico Housing Trust Fund.

NMAR **SUPPORTS SB 281** (Pirtle) which would provide for independent inspectors and establish time frames for inspections.

NMAR **SUPPORTS SB 286** (Ivey-Soto) which would prohibit the submission of a deed or other writing to the Office of the County Clerk that has attached a discriminatory restrictive covenant or gender specific language, and voids unlawful discriminatory restrictive covenants.

NMAR **OPPOSES HB 241** (Cates) as written, **HJR 4** (Ferrary), **SB 77** (Soules)

as written, SB 99 (Lopez), SJR 6 (Sedillo Lopez), and SJR 8 (Pirtle).
