As we approach the halfway point in the Session, the work of legislators, legislative staff, lobbyists, etc. will begin to increase as committees add more

bills to their agendas in an effort to do the work of the people. Legislators have the opportunity and responsibility to their constituents to pass meaningful legislation that will make for a better Land of Enchantment.

Today is the final day for legislators to work with legislative staff to draft bills and February 16th is the final day for introduction. In the next couple of days we will see an uptick in the amount of bills introduced on the chamber floors. For reference, in 2021, 933 bills were introduced, 17% of those bills passed both chambers and were sent to the governor. In 2019, 1,663 bills were introduced with 19% passing both chambers and sent to the governor. 2017, 1,473 introduced and 19% reaching the governors desk. Our predictions lead us to believe that we will reach the 1,000 bill mark by the deadline for introduction.
