We are officially halfway through the 60-day session of the 56th Legislature.

A total of **1,089** pieces of legislation have been introduced in this session. No new legislation can be introduced, now the focus turns to getting legislation through the process in committees and chambers before the session concludes at noon on March 18, 2023.

Stay tuned and ready to engage with legislators across the state as NMAR will surely need your help to communicate our position on proposed legislation. The New Mexico Association of REALTORS® is the voice of real estate in the Land of Enchantment.

NMAR needs your help to oppose two bills that would negatively impact private property rights if passed. SB298 and HB6 are scheduled for their first committee hearings this week. We need your help with providing public comment to communicate to legislators why these pieces of legislation negatively impact the industry and its stakeholders.

OPPOSE SENATE BILL 298

SB298 amends the Mobile Home Park Act to implement rent control, extends the eviction process for nonpayment of rent, and strips landlords of their ability to terminate rental agreements by limiting when/how they can proceed.

OPPOSE HOUSE BILL 6

HB6 makes changes to the Housing Codes in New Mexico by requiring a written statement of deductions, increasing civil penalties, increasing the time permitted to remedy nonpayment of rent, increasing the period of time required for nonpayment notices, prohibiting a landlord from refusing to renew or seek to terminate a rental agreement.
