Total Bills Passed One Chamber: **201**Total Bills Passed Both Chambers: **4**

Less than two weeks (12 ½ days) remain in the 56th Legislature; the session concludes at noon on Saturday, March 18th. As discussed in <u>last week's</u> <u>Legislative Bulletin</u>, it is full steam ahead for Legislators, Roundhouse Staff, Activists, Lobbyists, etc. to get the work done for the people of New Mexico. Below is an update on priority legislation that has made recent movement.

HB6, which we **OPPOSE**, was heard by the House Judiciary Committee on Friday, March 3, 2023. The Bill was **ROLLED** to a future meeting and has not yet been rescheduled.

HJR5, which we **SUPPORT**, passed the House of Representatives in a 67 to 0 vote, and will now head to Senate.

SB133, which we **SUPPORT**, has passed the Full Senate, and now awaits a scheduling in its final committee, House Judiciary.

SB139, 140, 141, and 495, which we SUPPORT, received a DO PASS in the Senate Health and Public Affairs Committee, and now await inclusion in the state budget by the Senate Finance Committee.

SB286, which we **SUPPORT**, has passed Senate Committees, and awaits consideration by the Full Senate.

SB298, which we **OPPOSE**, was heard by the Senate Health and Public Affairs Committee, and sent back to the bill sponsors to clean up language. The Bill has not yet been rescheduled.

SB333, which we **OPPOSE**, was heard by the Senate Health and Public Affairs Committee. The Bill received a **DO PASS** and is now awaiting the schedule of the Senate Judiciary Committee.

SB375 and 449, which we OPPOSE, are scheduled to be heard by the Senate Health and Public Affairs Committee TODAY, March 6, 2023, at 1:30 PM or ½ hour after the Full Senate Floor Session.

SB411, which we **OPPOSE**, was heard by the Senate Health and Public Affairs Committee on the night of Wednesday, March 1, 2023. The Bill received a **DO PASS** and is now awaiting the schedule of the Senate Judiciary Committee.

HB241, SB99, SJR6, all of which we OPPOSE, have been TABLED and are considered "dead" legislation.
