THE 56TH LEGISLATURE

Session Day: **54** Session Days Remaining: **5.5** Total Bills Introduced: **1,089** Total Bills Passed One Chamber: **325** Total Bills Passed Both Chambers: **30** We are in the final stretch of the 56th Legislature, the session concludes on Saturday, March 18, 2023 at noon.

Although the end of the session is near, there is much work to be done. Late nights extending into the morning hours with plenty of debate on legislation are in store for both the House and Senate.

This past weekend, the Senate approved the proposed budget of \$9.75 billion, which will be sent back to the House for concurrence before being sent to the governor. The House also approved an omnibus tax plan which wold provide rebate checks to the citizens of New Mexico, the legislation now heads to the Senate for consideration.

Below is an update on the legislation that we **SUPPORT** & **OPPOSE**.

HB6, SB133, & SB286 await a House Floor hearing.

HJR5 & **HJR6**, are scheduled to be heard by the <u>Senate Tax</u>, <u>Business &</u> <u>Transportation Committee</u> on Tuesday, March 14th, after the Floor Session.

SB139, 140, 141, & 495, are to be included in the State Budget (HB2).

SB333, 411, & 449 await a Senate Judiciary Committee hearing.

SB381, passed both chambers and was sent to the governor for consideration.

HB241, SB99, SB298, SB375, & SJR6, are TABLED and considered "dead" legislation.

HB241, HB425, HB497, HJR4, SB281, & SJR8 have STALLED in committee awaiting a hearing.
